Kallista Bell, PhD, RPsych

Dr. Kallista Bell is a Registered Psychologist (CPBC #2227) trained in clinical psychology at Simon Fraser University (SFU). She completed additional specialization and training in child/developmental clinical psychology. Dr. Bell works in private practice in the Comox Valley, completing psychoeducational assessments and providing therapy to adolescents and adults. In addition to her private therapy and assessment practice, Dr. Bell has provided contract assessments to multiple school districts.



Kimberley Da Silva, PhD, RPsych



Dr. Da Silva completed her Ph.D. at Simon Fraser University and her clinical internship at BC Children's Hospital. She dedicates part of her practice to providing psycho-educational assessments for developmental, behavioural, and learning concerns (e.g., ADHD, learning disabilities, giftedness). This includes cognitive and academic testing, as well as reports that can be used to advocate for accommodations and support. She also conducts assessments for young adults transitioning to university/college settings.
